For councils with grades 7-9: Silver= 11 points and Gold= 13 points

For councils with grades 6-8: Silver= 10 points and Gold= 12 points

- Attend Junior High Retreat= 2 points
- Attend Wintergizer= 2 points
- Attend VISION Conference= 3 points
- Attend SASC Conference= 3 points
- Attend District Workshop= 1 point
- Donate to State Charity: \$500=1 point, \$1500= 2 points, \$2500= 3 points
- Recruit a new AASC Member School= 1 point per school
- Nominate Administrator of the Year= 1 point
- Nominate Advisor of the Year= 1 point
- Nominate Mid-Level Member of the Year= 1 point
- Nominate Member of the Year= 1 point

Diamond Member (3 or more years of Gold status consecutively)-- if any Diamond Member fails to reach Gold, that council loses Diamond status and starts over

Spotlight: Anthony Gehrig

Meet Anthony Gehrig, a senior from Fort Worth, Texas who chose to spend his spring break experiencing a new culture and the lifechanging impact good people can have around the world.

He and his dad, Jason Gehrig, Subiaco Academy Class of '89, traveled to Bolivia, where Anthony was born while his parents were serving as Catholic missionaries for 7 ½ years with Maryknoll Lay Missionaries.

His first time back since he was 6 years old, Anthony was able to see the hospital where he was born, and enjoyed visiting with old friends and neighbors who all remember him as a child.

Anthony witnessed firsthand the transformational power of providing safe water access to those who need it. Jason is a longtime volunteer for the group WEFTA (Water Engineers for the Americas), and the Bolivian Waterworks group Suma Jayma, who designed and built the water system. The funding by the Wheaton Franciscan



Sisters of Indiana, the local municipal government, and the benefitting families, was able to provide safe water through household taps to 70 families in the Bolivian Andes.

Together, Anthony and Jason attended the inauguration of this new water system for the small Bolivian village that did not have previous access to safe drinking water. Anthony was asked to address the group. His father translated to Spanish for him, as he thanked the people for being so welcoming and expressed his appreciation for the beauty of their village and celebration.

This trip was a unique opportunity for Anthony that greatly impacted his perspective of the world and his appreciation for all those in it. We are so proud of our former AASC Executive President, Anthony Gehrig!
